

## **Supplies**

Blank paper Felt tip pen or marker (dark color) Safety pins, sewing pins, or masking tape Prize(s)

## Preparation

Develop a list of famous characters (people, animals, cars, etc.). Make sure you have as many characters as guests.

Cut an 8.5" by 11" into quarters. Write one name from your list of characters on each quarter sheet. Make sure to print the name legibly and large enough for people to read.

## Instructions

Pin or tape one quarter sheet on the back of every guest.

Guests may only ask each other "yes" and "no" questions to determine their character's identity.

Am I still alive? Do I sing for a living? Am I an animal? Have you seen me in a movie? Does my job involve politics?

The first guest to correctly identify their character wins a prize.

## **Notes**

This is a great icebreaker and will get your guests talking and mingling.

Consider creating a theme, such as cartoon characters, famous chefs, county music singers, or old movie actors. You can also base your theme on the bride's hobbies or interests. For example, if she is very fashion conscious, develop a list of famous models such as Tyra Banks, Christie Brinkley, and Cindy Crawford.

You're prize can match the theme as well. If the bride is interested in art, you could purchase a coffee mug with a Monet's painting. If she really likes country music, pick up a recently released CD.
